Hi Mary and Laura,

I would like to request the Board's permission to apply for funding from the Oregon Health Authority Health Systems Division to provide technical assistance on peer-delivered services for individuals with substance abuse disorders. The grant request will be for approximately \$383,000 for an 18 month period beginning January 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017; this timeframe is specified within the grant application. If awarded, we will contract with Project ABLE to provide technical assistance/training and services in Yamhill, Marion and Polk Counties. Local non-profits such as Champion Team and Provoking Hope will also be sub-recipients and have been involved in the initial planning. Even though this is a regional approach, Yamhill County HHS will be the backbone grant manager and funds are identified for contract management support within the grant.

If our grant application is successful, I will return to the Board to request ratification for the actual amount awarded and update the budget accordingly for adoption for fiscal year 2016-2017. Please let me know if you have any questions.
